ABOUT DEHRADUN

Dehradun is the capital city of Uttarakhand, located in the Garhwal region, it is 236 km from Delhi. It is one of the "Counter Magnets" of the National Capital Region (NCR), developed as an alternative centre of growth to help ease the migration and population explosion in the Delhi metropolitan area. Dehradun is the Doon Valley on the foothills of the Himalayas nestled between two of India's mightiest rivers the Ganges on the east and the Yamuna on the west. The city is famous for its picture landscape, slightly milder climate and provides a gateway to the surrounding region. It is well connected and in proximity to popular Himalayan tourist destinations such as Mussoorie, Nainital & Auli and the Hindu holy cities of Haridwar and Rishikesh along with the Himalayan pilgrimage circuit of Char Dham.

Dehradun is renowned for its natural resources, publishing services and particularly for its prestigious educational institutions. It is one of the highest rain receiving areas of North India. It hosts some of India's best schools and training institutions of national importance such as the Indian Military Academy, Wadia Institute of Himalayan Geology, Indian Institute of Remote Sensing, Wildlife Institute of India and the Forest Research Institute. Dehradun is also known as City of Schools.

ACCESSIBILITY

Dehradun is well connected with most of the metropolitan cities of the country by Air, Rail and Road.

AIR : The nearest Airport from Dehradun is Jolly Grant Airport . Air India, Jet Airways and SpiceJet offers daily flights from Delhi while jet airways operates a daily hopping flight (stop at Delhi) from Mumbai and Thiruvananthapuram (via Bangalore and Delhi). Air India has direct 50 minutes flight from Lucknow to Dehradun. Jolly Grant Airport is 25 km from the City of Dehradun.

ROAD : Dehradun is linked to all parts of the country by road. Luxury Volvo and Deluxe buses are easily available from Delhi to Dehradun. Deluxe and semi-deluxe buses run to Shimla and Mussoorie from Dehradun Interstate Bus Terminal (ISBT) near Clement Town. The distances to Dehradun from some of the major cities are Delhi 255 km, Haridwar 54 km, Rishikesh 42 km, Agra 382 km, Shimla 221 km, Yamunotri 279 km, Kedarnath 270 km and Nainital 297 km.

RAILWAY : The town has its own Railway Station known as Dehradun railway station with services to major cities including Delhi, Mumbai, Kolkata, Lucknow, Trivandrum, Vadodara and Varanasi. Some fast trains running to and from Dehradun include the Shatabdi Express, Jan-Shatabdi Express and New Delhi-Dehradun AC Express (to be renamed as Nanda Devi Express).
