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- ABOUT JUSTICE V.R.KRISHNA IYER


Justice V. R. Krishna Iyer (1914–2014) was a pioneering Indian jurist and a stalwart of social justice. Serving as a judge in the Supreme Court of India, his tenure from 1973 to 1980 left an indelible mark on the legal landscape. A champion of human rights, he believed in the judiciary's role as a guardian of the marginalized. Justice Iyer was renowned for his progressive judgments, emphasizing equity and fairness. His legal philosophy advocated for the downtrodden, earning him widespread respect. Beyond the bench, he contributed to legal literature and tirelessly campaigned for prison reforms. His legacy endures as an emblem of judicial activism and compassion.
